

Is there a lot of information about the subject or just about one specific area?

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Do you basically understand what the author wrote? Is it too hard or too easy for a 4<sup>th</sup> Grader to read?

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Does the site have interesting information you haven't read anywhere else?

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Is the information current? Can you tell the date the information was created and/or changed?
